Pollinator Habitat Creation & Enhancement

Our group is Sustainable Moorestown appointed by town council. Our members are involved in many other community green Team groups such as schools, churches scouts and Save the Enviroment of Moorestown. Last year we cleared and planted a large pollinator area in an area that the township previously had to maintain by mowing and herbicides. We worked with a Sunday School to expand a children's pollinator garden. Members from churches, scouts, stem and our Green team worked together to remove siltgrass from trails and open spaces. The children also made and painted many birdhouses and a few bat houses and the adults installed them.
