Wildlife Gardening Workshop and Pollinator Celebration Week

Wildlife Gardening Workshop (March 9) - Attendees learned the basics about creating a wildlife and pollinator garden, how to identify common native pollinators, and the value and importance of native plants. Participants received a copy of the City of Wilsonville's Pollinator Toolkit and free native plants. Twenty people attended the workshop.

Pollinator Week Celebration (June 19) - The event included informational tables, pollinator videos, and free native plants. Partners participating in the event included Plant4Pollinators and the Backyard Habitat Certification Program. Fifteen people attended the event.
