

Basically, we maintain the two large gardens. If something isn't working there we replace it with something else. Now, when other small beds fail, we have gradually begun replacing them with native plants. This year we added native Turks' cap to pocket areas of our campus as well as Blackfoot Daisy, *Salvia farinacea*, and *artemesia*. We have plans to add *Eupatorium havenense*.

Habitat enhancement is a hard one to nail down because it is not done with volunteers; our landscape crew does it. It is a change in the culture at ACU, a departure from traditional formal landscaping. We are doing it as needed rather than on specific dates on a schedule. Different things are replaced as needed during the growing season.

POLICIES & PRACTICES

Our committee consists of Grounds Manager, Gayenell Rainwater; Director of Grounds, Scott Warren; Team Leads, David Scot and Cole Stevens; and Jim Carpenter, Professor of Environmental Science. We will continue to try to draw students into the committee through the Agriculture and Environmental Science classes. The Grounds Department supplied seed for the Agriculture Department to grow some native species for a landscape project.
