

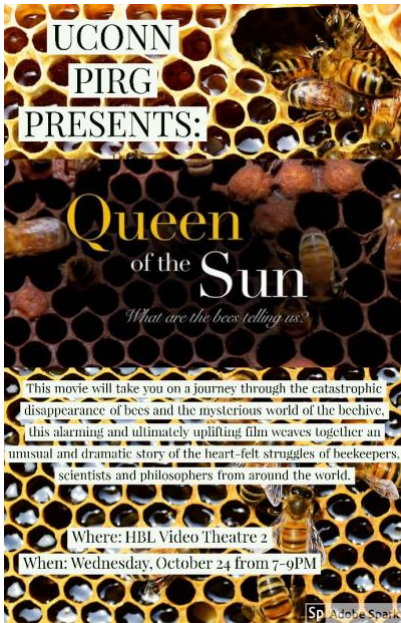


Bee Campus USA Annual Report for 2018 Pollinator Conservation & Education
