EDUCATION & OUTREACH



NOTE: Washington College only became a Bee Campus USA affiliate on April 3, 2018 and is not due to submit an annual report until February 2020. But they couldn't wait to get started and shared thie following news.

Pollinator Photography Contest (April 30) - 19 students submitted 41 photos, 150 students participated in voting through the people's choice category.

Honey Extraction Workshop (February 4) - When robber bees took out the Campus Garden hives, the students borrowed an

extractor from the Upper Eastern Shore Beekeeping Association to harvest the honey and sell it as a fundraiser to purchase more bees.
